<p>Malcolm Bowekaty is from Zuni Pueblo and served as a Zuni Pueblo Governor for 4 years. In addition, Malcolm is a University of New Mexico graduate in Sociology and Psychology; CEO of Inter-tribal Information Technologies and the Inter-Tribal Economic Alliance. Malcolm has presented on a wide variety of topics nation-wide and recently has been assisting schools to address the issues of bullying, communication with children and cultural competence for students.</p>	<p>Dr. J'Anne Affeld is a licensed psychologist and professor of special education at Northern Arizona University. She taught for a number of years in K-12 classrooms in Arizona. She is an internationally recognized expert in classroom management and pro-active discipline solutions. She was nominated five times as teacher who made the most difference for the Outstanding Senior at the Center for Excellence in Education at NAU. J'Anne has published more than 30 articles and presented in over 70 conferences, including 10 countries.</p>
<p>Martha Affeld is a Masters level counselor and hypnotherapist. She was the CFO and drama teacher at the Belle Affeld Beloved Humanities Academy, a school she founded. Martha worked as a special education instructor at NAU and was the author of a \$450,000 grant to bring the humanities to students in high school. She is also a professional Ball Room Dancing instructor as an avocation. She is also currently writing her tenth book.</p>	<p>Jan LaPrelle is an Independent Contractor for Sundance Educational Consulting, Inc. Jan has a Bachelor of Science degree in Graphic Communications. She has travelled extensively in Arizona and New Mexico working with parents of Native American children to provide training in how to work with standards-based activities to improve student achievement in math and reading. Jan specializes in areas of parent involvement training for schools.</p>
<p>Dr. Scott Gullett is currently a teacher of Gifted Students at the Public Academy of Performing Arts in Albuquerque, New Mexico. Dr. Gullett is also an Independent Contractor for Sundance Educational Consulting and has worked with schools in New Mexico and Arizona on CORE Standards implementation as well as parent and staff training in Standards-Based education.</p>	<p>D'Wayne Begay (Navajo) is currently the Director of tennis for the Four Hills Country Club in Albuquerque, New Mexico. In addition, D'Wayne has founded the Red Bear Tennis Program which provides tennis activities for at-risk youth Nation-wide. D'Wayne is a Nationally ranked tennis player and uses his skills as a teacher to provide opportunities for Native American students to learn tennis and improve their academic, social and physical achievement.</p>
<p>Tom Prettyman is a Senior Scientist at the Planetary Science Institute "PSI", a not-for-profit NASA research institute centered in Tucson. Tom is one of several PSI scientists working in New Mexico and is proud to call Albuquerque home. Tom's Ph.D. is in Nuclear Engineering, and his area of expertise is nuclear spectroscopy applied to planetary remote sensing. He has experience mapping the chemical composition of the Moon and Mars from the Lunar Prospector and Mars Odyssey missions. He is a Co-investigator of the NASA Dawn mission, for which he is the Team Lead for Geochemistry and Principal Investigator for the Gamma Ray and Neutron Detector "GRaND", the only US payload instrument on Dawn.</p>	<p>Dr. Natalie Martinez is from Laguna Pueblo. She serves as the Curriculum & Instruction Coach at Laguna Middle School and is an adjunct professor at Central New Mexico Community College in the division of Teacher Education. She has been a middle-school/high-school classroom teacher for 18 years and has organized professional development training for adults. Dr. Martinez is interested in working towards Indigenizing education for Native students and their teachers; she is currently working with the Generating Educators for Native American Communities partnership between the Native American Community Academy and CNM in Albuquerque.</p>
<p>Joe DiRaddo has lived in the New Mexico East Mountains for 13 years. He has practiced in a variety of private and public agencies for over 25 years. Joe is also licensed as a Marriage and Family Therapist as well as being Reality Therapist Certified. His passion is working with and empowering youth.
